### MEET YOUR OFFICERS

Stuart Hayes, Vice-President of the UPAA is the Manager of the Photo Lab for Lamar State University which is a three-campus regional institution in the Texas system of state-supported schools with a total enrollment of about 12,000.

Stu reports that his lab is a general services operation serving all the needs of news, sports information and putlic relations as well as the campus in general, academic, social and physical. They maintain a file of current P&W photos and color slides of sports and student campus and classroom activities for use in publications and slide presentations. An online ID card system is under his operation.

The lab is staffed by a coordinator, assistant and secretary and several student assistants. Services done in the lab include B&W and slide copies from photos and flat art; slide duplication; display prints up to 16x20 routinely and 4x8 foot upon special request; B&W processing and printing of University-related photos and color slide processing with negative color processing being sent out.

Only 840 square feet is allocated for the lab but it is modern and air-conditioned. For 35mm, Nikon cameras are used almost exclusively along with a Hasselblad and four lenses for 120 format and a 4x5 view camera.

If you would like further information on Stu's lab, he has a detailed overview that I am sure he would send you upon request. Next month Ralph Homan will report from the University of New Orleans.

# UPAA Constitution ammended April 1978

### ARTICLE ONE--NAME AND PURPOSE

The name of this organization shall be the UNIVERSITY PHOTOGRAPHERS ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA.

It shall be the purpose of the UPAA to:

- Further and develop the potentialities of the Photographic Arts in improving Instruction and Communication.
- Foster and further Photographic Techniques as a result of interchange of thoughts and opinions among its members.
- 3. Cooperate with other organizations which may be striving to accomplish similar purposes.
- 4. Acquaint educational institutions of this Association in an effort to establish confidence in and provide good will for the "Association members.

#### ARTICLE TWO--MEMBERSHIP

SECTION ONE--ELIGIBILITY.

Membership shall be open to all without regard to race, color, sex, religion, national origin, handicap or age.

- 1. INSTITUTIONAL MEMBERSHIP shall be open to any College or University. This type of membership shall apply to the position rather than the person. Eac position applying for membership shall be subject to full dues, and shall be accorded all rights and priviledges.
- 2. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP shall be open to any College or University personnel engaged profession-ally in photography. Each individual shall be subject to full dues and shall be accorded all! rights and priviledges.

- 3. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP shall be open to anyone not eligible for institutional or individual membership. They will pay full dues, but may not enter competitions, vote or hold office.
- 4. LIFE MEMBERSHIP shall be bestowed at the discretion of the Executive Board. Life members shall be accorded all rights and priviledges of institutional or individual members without being required to pay dues.
- 5. CHARTER MEMBERSHIP shall be given to all persons subscribing to this constitution.

### SECTION TWO--ELECTION TO MEMBERSHIP

A person, upon recommendation of the Officers, shal be certified for membership by meeting the eligibility requirements and upon payment of annual dues.

### SECTION THREE--VOTING

Each institutional, individual and life member in attendance shall be entitled to one vote.

### SECTION FOUR--DUES

Annual dues shall become due July 1 of each year. Members failing to pay dues by October 1 of the same year, will be considered delinquent and dropped from the membership rolls.

# ARTICLE THREE--OFFICERS-BOARD-COMMITTES-CHAIRMEN

# SECTION ONE--ELECTED OFFICERS

The UPAA shall have an elected President, Vice-President and Secretary/Treasurer. Elections shall be held annually. Elections shall be by written ballot by a majority vote of the members represented at the annual busines meeting, with each member in good standing entitled to one vote.

### SYMPOSIUM HIGHLITES

Thom Brommerich from the Fishback School of spoke to those attending Photography the Symposium in Denver on the Glen Fishback Exposure System. He emphasized that many Photographers do not realize that their meters are deliberately calibrated to relate readings to the amount of light that it will take to produce a gray card value, and they fail to compensate for the readings taken off surfaces with values other than 18% reflectance. Thus they get inconsistent results.

He recommends using fresh developer each time you process film to guarantee consistency and to use a repeatable patern of agitation with Panatomic-X and Tri-X developed in C-76 (one gallon of D-76 plust4 ounces of Crone Additive C). Development for 35mm Panatomic-X is 4-1/4 minutes and for Tri-X is 4-1/2 minutes at 68 degrees with 10 seconds agitation at the beginning and 10 seconds per minute thereafter.

The Fishback Exposure system is based on using a spot meter to break down the tones in a scene into seven different categories.

Value 1 Black (d-max)

albert Value 2 Black with texture

Value 3 Neero skin tone

Value 4 Gray card (18% reflectance)

Value 5 Caucasian skin tone

Value 6 White with texture

Value 7 White (d-min)
